Your Planner



Your planner helps you out with many things such as; homework, timetable and communication. You will be given a planner on your first day in school. It is a great way for parents to send in important messages for your tutor or the school and for your tutor to send a message to your parents.

Homework

Homework is set using a homework timetable, this will be given out to you when you start school. It will explain which subjects you will get homework for on which day. We expect pupils in Year 7 to have 20 minutes of homework per subject each week. Homework can be set online, on one of the apps we use (Seneca, SPARX etc.) or a worksheet in your book. Your teachers will explain all of this information to you when you start with us.



What if you are absent?



Make sure we are contacted the morning of absence, You can email attendance@nelthorpe.org.uk or call the school on 01652 656551 to report an absence. Medical notes can be brought to the form tutor for signing. Any emails will be forwarded to your form tutor so they know why you are not in school.



Uniform

Our uniform is non-gendered and includes...

General

- Black school blazer with school crest
- School tie
- Black school trousers (**straight full leg with the hem touching the top of the shoe to hide the ankle, not jean-style, slim-fit or skinny style**) or pleated black knee-length skirt to ensure pupil decency is maintained (**the hem must touch the top of the knee, nothing shorter**)
- Shirt: White (long or short sleeved - worn tucked in and top button fastened) or navy blue striped school blouse (worn tucked in, collar inside blazer)
- Dark grey / black socks with trousers. White socks or black tights with a skirt. No trainer socks. Socks should be above the ankle in length.

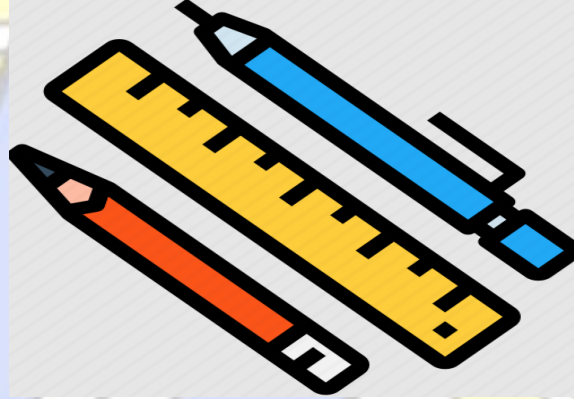
All shoes must be school polishable black shoes, no logos or trainer styles.

Uniform can be purchased online or in store at Uniform Direct. We also have an online shop of good quality gifted uniform and also donate uniform to the monthly Eco Fair at St Johns Church in Brigg. Details are on the school website and will be emailed out to parents.

Equipment

We expect our pupils to all come to school ready to learn, your equipment is your responsibility.



You are expected to bring the following with you to school every day: Pens (black, blue & purple), 30cm ruler, protractor, highlighter, pair of compasses, pencils, glue stick, scientific calculator and your school planner (which we will give to you on your first day). We have a number of bottle filling stations around the school and pupils should bring a refillable water bottle so they can keep hydrated throughout the day. Mobile phones are not allowed in school so pupils bringing them in must leave them turned off in their bags until the end of the day.

Bullying

Bullying is not tolerated in our school in any form. We have a whole school policy on bullying, that is reiterated and taught in PSHCE, form and assemblies. Any reports of bullying are taken very seriously. Bullying includes actions such as making threats, spreading rumours, attacking someone physically or verbally, and excluding someone from a group on purpose. This includes cyberbullying.

Your point of contact is your form tutor but we also have our Learning Coordinator Mrs. Hardisty and our Pupil Additional Support Service BUT you can talk to ANY adult in the school.



Getting started

Make sure everything is named and ready for September, you don't want to lose anything! Lost property always finds its way back to the school office but it is a big site so it is easier if items are named so we can get these back to you. Make sure you ask any questions in advance so that you are ready for Year 7.
